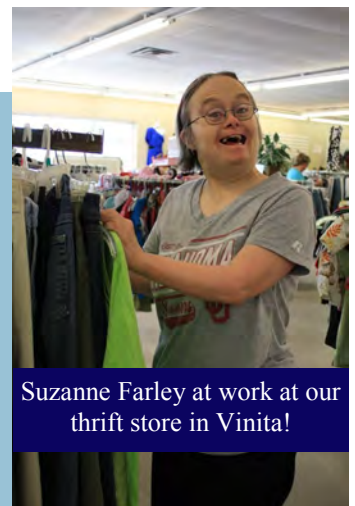

Okay, so maybe we do. But the fact is, a great deal has happened at Home of Hope in the last year that we're proud of:

- The Jim & Marja Willis Riding Arena was completed and is now in full swing, serving 55 clients in the past year.
- Our expansion of three six-bed homes in Vinita to eight bed-homes was also completed.
- We had our best year ever in the Mary Moore golf tournament, raising \$22,000 for

Hope of Hope's involvement in Special Olympics.

- We more than doubled the number of Home of Hope residents participating in our own golf program.
- We also added a new fundraiser, the "Run Jack Run" 5K run.
- Home of Hope became a fingerprinting site for organizations from near and far, raising funds and also streamlining the process for our own new hires.
- We had the largest number of athletes in the state participating in both the Sum-
