Claremore, Miami, Pryor, and just across the border in Chetopa, Kansas. These stores rely almost entirely on donated items and can use almost everything, from clothing to household items, from DVD's to furniture. Thanks to the donation of a building by Joe Gunn, a grant from the Donna Nigh Foundation, and a tremendous amount of work by our staff, Home of Hope has just added a distribution center in Vinita as well. Located at 1300 Industrial Drive, the distribution center gives you an additional place to drop off all that stuff you'd like to clean out of your garage. It also gives the men and women in our programs an additional place to work, separating and sorting items to be taken to meet the needs of customers at our different stores. Next door to the distribution center is our new Last Stop Shop, your last chance to purchase substantially discounted items before they disappear from our inventory. Home of Hope's stores are the ultimate win-win-win. The

revenue the stores bring in goes directly to support the programs and services at Home of Hope. The stores provide a tremendous benefit to the community. And moments like Terry getting his paycheck (pictured above) make it all worthwhile. As Amanda puts it, "I love my store, my customers, the men and women I work with."
